Biography assignment:

What ideas have fundamentally changed different cultures in the Eastern Hemisphere?

From the year 375 to 1300 there have been numerous individuals that have created an impact on society. From the Romans to Muslims, men and women have given their minds and sometimes their lives that have left an everlasting effect on our world today. It is your responsibility to find one individual from this time period who has left an impact on our world.

Tasks to be completed:

Step One: Pick your person. There are endless choices here. Please make sure you check it out with me prior to beginning. Once you have your person, you need to gather at least 6 resources on that person and perform some document analysis. You will turn in your document analysis with your final essay.

Step Two: You need to answer **three** of the following ten questions. Some questions may not apply to your person, so choose carefully. Plagiarism will not be tolerated. Plagiarism consists of but is not limited to: Copy and paste, poor paraphrasing, not citing material.

- 1. What kind of leadership do they display, and how did it affect people? Examples
- 2. What kind of government existed, how did this person affect, (or how were they affected) by this government?
- 3. Analyze the hierarchy of society, and the role that this person played within the hierarchy.
- 4. How do the conflicts taking place during your person's time compare with today's conflicts?
- 5. Explain how this individual made their society better. Examples
- 6. Why is the time, place, or event, important to learn about and why do we study it?
- 7. Analyze the religions that were practiced and do they still thrive today, how was your individual involved?
- 8. Explain the cultural/governmental advancements that the society has made and how your individual was part of it.
- 9. Was your person part of advancement in technology? Analyze how technology was used then, and how it is used today for the same action.
- 10. (If there is a question that you would like to pursue with regard to your individual we can formulate some together. Formulating at least two of your own questions for Advanced grade)

Using the above 3 questions of your choice, please write a developed 3 paragraph essay response for eachPlease make sure you cite your sources, and provide claim, 1 reason, evidence to support reason, and justification. Intro and conclusion as well please. (Advanced will show a counter argument) We will also take some time to revise your essays in class through peer editing and defense preparation.

Step Three: Biography Symposium

1. Please prepare to act as your important individual. In a Socratic Seminar setting we will conduct a symposium of sorts to discuss our various philosophies, doctrines, and ideas.

- a. Sample questions for the symposium could look something like these: Thus preparing for these questions will aid in your discussion grade.
 - i. Human beings are innately good, what are your viewpoints?
 - ii. All religions have merit and should all be equally respected
 - iii. Government should be ruled by those with the Divine right to rule (nobility only please)
 - iv. Medicine and Science is only for those who wish to not reach Heaven
 - v. Imperialism at any cost!
 - vi. Freedom is for those born into higher classes, while those whom are beneath live at the pleasure of those above them.
