## Civilization characteristics:

- Stable food/water supply What were the primary food sources? Where did fresh water come from?
- Social structure Who was at the top? The bottom? The middle? Was it a strictly enforced system? Could people work hard and rise?
- Government Who made the key societal decisions? How was the law enforced?
- Religion Who held religious leadership? Was is the same as the government? What were the deities like?

- Monumental architecture What did it look like, what was it made out of? How and why was it built?
- Art Who were the artists? What did they produce? Why? Out of what materials?
- Trade Who were the trade partners of this civilization? What did this civilization bring to trade and what did it get in return?
- Warfare and conflict How were conflicts over land and resources resolved? Did this civilization use original war tactics or technology?
- Geographic boundaries/nature and climate What was the natural landscape for this civilization? How did the location help establish the civilization? How did seasons and climate affect the people?
- Writing and technology What was the recording/writing system? What did it look like? When was it deciphered? What new innovations did this civilization bring to the world?
