Your role: You are the parent of Car A's driver. Your child is a responsible driver, though new. This Corvette driver was going too fast and shouldn't sue because this was not done on purpose. It was an accident, and your kid is only 16!

Scenario: Person A TP'd person B's house last night because person A was bullying at school. Discuss who should be at fault and who should clean up the mess.

Your role: You are Person A.

Your role: You are Person B.

Your role: Friend of Person B

Your role: Parent of Person A

Your role: Cop

Scenario: A new technology in medicine could help people with cancer live longer, but it costs thousands of dollars to try. Should this treatment be offered to all patients? Only some? Should it be required?

Your role: A doctor specializing in cancer treatment

Your role: You are a family member of a patient who could use this medication, but you don't have much money

Your role: You are a nurse at a hospital and have seen how not all medications and technologies are successful.

Your role: You recently lost a family member to cancer, even after many various treatments.

Your role: You are a scientist who is part of the breakthrough technology team.

Scenario: School administration decides that all students must wear uniforms (polo shirts and khakis). Should this become a rule for all students? Why? Should there

be any exceptions?

Your role: You are a student without a lot of money and some kids make fun of your

clothes.

Your role: You are a student with a lot of money and individuality.

Your role: You are a teacher.

Your role: You are a parent.

Your role: You are the principal.

Scenario: The cast list of the school musical was just posted. The student who got the lead part is also the child of the director. Discuss if this is ok with you or not and why. Is it fair?

Your role: You are the director and try to make the best, most fair choice of who is best for the part.

Your role: You are the student who got the lead role. Yay!

Your role: You are friends with the student who got the lead part and you know they deserved it because of talent.

Your role: You are the parent of a student who did not make it into the show.
